ELECTIONS

<u>GENERAL ELECTION</u> - NOVEMBER 7, 2023. Don't forget to vote! This November we have a City General Election for Mayor (2-year term) and Council (three seats, 4-year terms each).

<u>PERMANENT ABSENT VOTER LIST:</u> Forms are available at City Hall to be on the permanent absent voter list. Applications for ballots for the November election have been mailed to those on the list. This process will change after the November election. After November, once an application is on file, you will automatically have a ballot sent to you for every election in the future, until cancelled. For those who use a P.O. Box, please include that information in your request. Ballots can be mailed back with the included postage paid envelope or dropped off at City Hall anytime in the ballot drop boxes.

BRUSH PICK-UP: <u>1st Wednesday</u> of each month April thru November Light yard work & trimming. Set branches out with cut end to the curb.

GRASS AND WEEDS MAINTENANCE: Please cut the lawn or make arrangements to do it. If the City mows, the bill begins at \$300 per hour. Support a local mowing business instead.

TRASH COLLECTION SCHEDULE:

The City's collection day is MONDAY.

Emterra does not collect on Memorial Day, July 4th, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Year's Day. When holiday is on

Monday, collection is the next day.

Contact Emterra for scheduling pick up of large items 1-877-609-6753 City Residents can drop off up to 1 yard of trash per month at the landfill for free. The landfill is located on McMillan Road. between W.

McTaggart and W. Atwater Roads

Utility Bills (Contact us to set up email billing and information on how to pay your account online)

Pay ½ Of the Utility Bill by October 25th and the rest by November 27th without late fees. Pay the "amount due" on the bottom of the first sheet of the bill, that is the total owed. If you used water, but you're NOT billed for consumption, call the Water Plant to have your meter checked. If you wait you will have to pay for the consumption all at once when an actual reading is obtained. WE NEED YOUR PHONE NUMBER! This helps us to contact you for emergencies (water leaks, frozen pipes, etc.)

REPORT WATER LEAKS - IF YOU SEE OR HEAR WATER running in a building or see standing water on a lot where it usually does not pool, PLEASE CALL THE WATER DEPT (989) 856-4407.

Water turn off: When leaving for an extended amount of time, it is recommended to have the DPW turn off your water. The City DPW will turn your water off and on for free during normal work days from 7a to 3p.(Someone has to be present for turn on) If your water freezes and breaks you will be responsible for the lost water. Call the water plant to arrange turn off and on at (989) 856-4407.
